Last year, more than 3,000 children and adults were seen at the Story County Dental Clinic, which provides services to those who are Medicaid-eligible and to uninsured people whose incomes fall below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines.

Most dentists in Iowa do not accept Medicaid patients because of the low insurance reimbursements rates, and many low income people have no dental insurance. As a result, some Story County residents cannot afford to see a dentist. At the clinic, Medicaid patients pay a \$3 co-pay and other eligible patients pay Medicaid rates. Appointments are required, but the clinic does not turn away those who walk into the clinic in pain.

Services offered at the clinic include cleaning, exams, x-rays, fillings, basic extractions, root canals, crowns and dentures/partials. The clinic currently employs one permanent dentist, one hygienist, two dental assistants, and a receptionist. Volunteers make reminder calls, pull charts, do the filing, and make new patient packets; volunteers are urgently needed. The clinic is open Monday-Thursday from 8AM-6PM. It is supported by civic groups, local agencies, individual donors, and faith-based communities, including St. Cecilia Parish, which makes a monthly donation from its Good Samaritan Fund. It does not receive federal aid.

In March, 2011, the MICA health service clinic and dental clinic moved to 230 SE 16th Street. Moving the old dental equipment and renovating the new space cost more than \$130,000. Because of that, MI-CA is asking for help in paying for the dental clinic's debt, as well covering the gap between treatment costs and reimbursement (the gap is 41%).

## Gabriel Project



The Gabriel Project is a program in which parishioners assist pregnant women in need with friendship and coordinate their needs such as transportation for medical care, housing, food, material needs and baby needs. It started with a sign outside a rectory in Houston in 1973, following the Roe v. Wade decision. The sign offered to help any pregnant woman in need. In 1990, Cathy McConn and Rex Moses saw the sign and asked their Bishops if they could make this outreach. And so began the Gabriel Project.

The St. Cecilia kick-off for this project was on Respect Life Sunday. The formal training for all volunteers, who will mentor and assist women in crisis pregnancies, was held on November 12 with Dr. Marcella Colburn, Director of the Respect Life Office for the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston.
