- D. Unfinished business
  - 1. Christmas Market on Nov. 19 & 20. Doreen reported the event was very successful, with the highest total from the recycled decorations. Remaining decorations were donated to the Food at First Pass Along Party and Goodwill.
  - 2. Respect Life and Social Justice formation: Dec. 28; <a href="dbqarch.org/rlsj/formation">dbqarch.org/offices/respect-life/respect-life-and-social-justice-formation-for-all/</a>. The program will begin at St. Cecilia on Dec. 28. It will be led by Deacon Ron.
  - 3. Klingseis estate No news.
  - 4. Need board member or representatives for AMOS.
  - 5. Pastoral Council Sarah's report said PC is still working on prioritizing building/renovation projects. That was the significant portion of last meeting. The next step is to have a joint meeting between pastoral council and finance council to discuss budget but nothing is progressing quickly. They discussed the success of the Music Walk.
  - 6. Financial reports Becca. Monetary receipts: Estimated value of food shelf donations: \$923.20. Disbursements for November and December (combined): \$5905.33. Bank Balance as of November 30, 2016: \$82,199.37. Discretionary funds available: \$1669.04. December's special allocations: Heartland Senior services, \$250; MICA for transportation to the Iowa Food Bank, \$150; YSS for Stork's Nest, \$250. Committee agreed to designate the reminder of Thanksgiving collection (42229) for individual assistance, after \$500 has been subtracted for a possible Harvest of Blessings matching grant. Julie applied for the grant for ERP. She has obtained it twice.
  - 7. Parishioners' assistance Sarah will meet with Father Jim after Christmas.
  - 9. Committee reports:
    - a. Good Samaritan Fund/Food Pantry donation: 577 pounds in November. Dec. 17/18 Tom & Dorothy Sally; January 21/22 Chuck Habing; February 18/19 Keith & Linda Huls
    - b. Hunger Collaboration Doreen hopes to attend the next meeting when Marlene notifies her about it.
    - c. Food at First –Doreen. The Pass-Along Party was very successful, with approximately 90 people shopping for (donated) gifts.
    - d. Good Neighbor Phyllis. Good Neighbor will have its 20 anniversary celebration in April. They will not have a Dublin Bay fundraiser next year.
    - e. Restorative Justice Barb. No report.

- f. Individual Assistance Ron has had many requests for assistance. One family we have been helping has finally been granted disability. The refugee we have helped to support is employed.
- g. Emergency Residence Project Julie reported that the shelter has been averaging 10-11 clients per night with an average of four motel rooms per night. The dining room ceiling fell; Carrie is getting estimates for redoing the upstairs shower. The city paid the remainder of a \$28,000 grant from ASSET. Carrie is developing a shelter policing handbook (required for a grant beginning Jan. 1). Carrie wants more procedures/policies regarding cleanliness and hygiene, terminating shelter, length of stays, and service animals. ERP needs volunteers in the afternoon/early evening hours. A volunteer will offer haircuts weekly. There will be two interns in the spring. A plan for a less-expensive backyard renovation was presented by Jim Mason.
- h. AMOS. Meeting was on Dec. 12.
- i. Gabriel Project Bethany. No report.
- j. Sanctity of Life Garland's report mentioned the Right to Life and Social Justice program, as well as tentative plans for March. The March for Life in DSM has been cancelled, but a special Mass will be held. Details are in the bulletin.
- k. Home for Awhile Mary. Demand exceeds supply with many applying who need much assistance.
- l. Days for Girls Mary. We continue to see new interest and the program has a good group of volunteers.

There was a short discussion about topics for the February Social Justice newsletter, possibly with an article on the Giving Tree.
