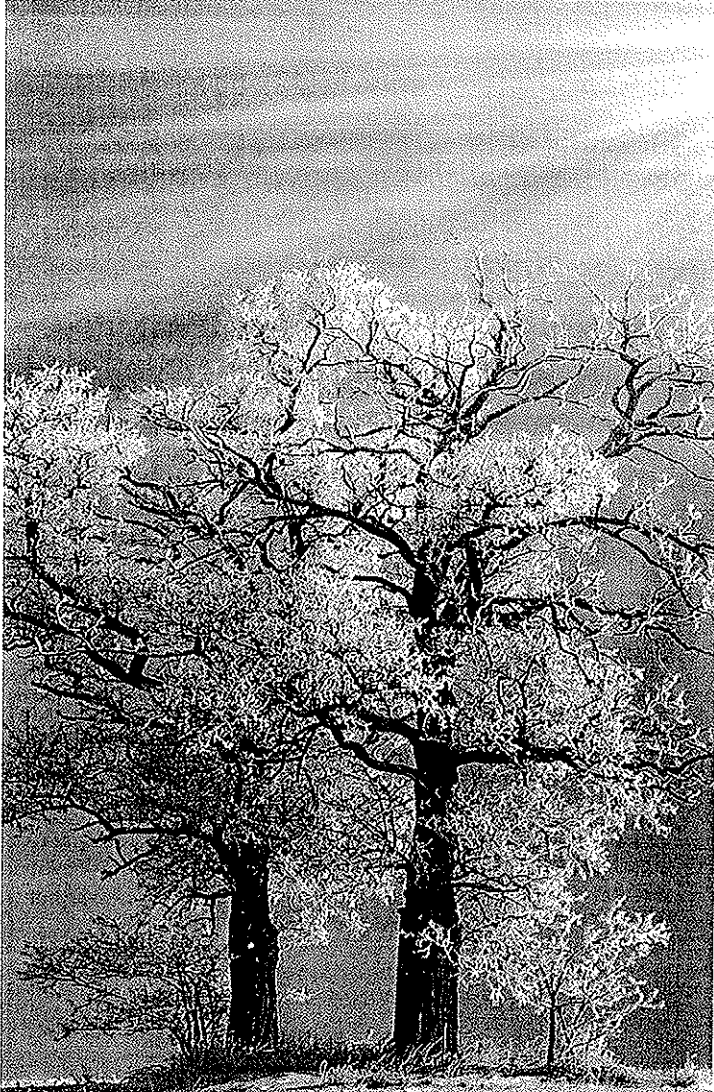

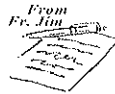

BREAD FOR THE JOURNEY #41 CONCLUDING RITES (PART III)

This understanding of the missionary dimension of the Mass has been articulated by Pope Benedict XVI in his recent exhortation, *Sacramentum caritatis*. The Pope eloquently states, "The mystery of the Eucharist inspires and impels us to work courageously within our world to bring about that renewal of relationships which has its inexhaustible source in God's gift. . . In a particular way, the Christian laity, formed at the school of the Eucharist, are called to assume their specific political and social responsibilities"(91). For the Pope, the Eucharist "schools" us and sends us out for our responsibilities as social and political persons. Therefore, the social dimensions of the Mass extend beyond the walls of the Church to live the mission Christ gives to the Church. What is this social mission that Christ gives to us? The Pope offers two ways we embody the social mission of Christ. The first is through "the sanctification of the world" (92). To sanctify is to grow in holiness. God sends us forth to work for holiness in the political and the social spheres of life. Pope Benedict XVI also alerts us to our mission of being good stewards of God's creation. "The world is not something indifferent, raw material to be utilized simply as we see fit. Rather, it is part of God's good plan . . . (92). Therefore, as the Pope mentions, our second responsibility of the social mission of Christ is to work "responsibly for the protection of creation"(92). All of creation belongs to God alone. God entrusted to us this precious gift in order to take good care of it and all creatures.

4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Athletes put hours into practice. It is not enough just to play the game. In practice a person learns the moves, discovers how muscles respond, trains all aspects of his or her body, and over time becomes so proficient at the selected sport that she or he can intuitively react during play. Practice in sports helps the athlete develop self-confidence. The same holds true for the musician, the salesperson, the new teacher. When an individual takes up something new he or she may initially be a bit shaky at it. Over time, we develop the skills so that something becomes second nature. A confident team takes to the field or the court with the belief that they will win.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is the confident, self-assured teacher. Yes, he works a miracle. But before we get caught up in that, we should look at how Mark portrays him. Right at the beginning of the Gospel, Jesus enters the synagogue in Capernaum and starts to teach. Unlike the scribes who would appeal to the words of Jewish teachers to support their teaching, Jesus comes across as confident in his own authority. He has no need to reference what others have handed on. Instead, his teaching commands respect because he shows its truth through his deeds.

Like the athlete who is confident in his game, we can become confident in our faith by practicing it. As we see in the Gospel from the very first chapter of Mark, Jesus was confident in both word and deed. We can do the same. By reading the Scriptures regularly we become attuned to Christ's teaching. We absorb the knowledge, just as any good athlete memorizes all the plays. And by acting on Christ's teaching through our worship of God and love of neighbor we are performing the deeds of faith. The skills become second nature as we put into practice what we have been taught by Christ. ©2011 Liturgical Publications Inc

Mass Intention Stipend Amount Policy

Periodically we receive inquiries regarding Mass Stipends. The custom of making offerings (stipends) to have a Mass celebrated for a specific intention is a laudable one. The law of the Church thus protects the right of the faithful to make such offerings and the right of the priest to receive such offerings (canon 945, #1). Church teaching and the Law of the Church (canons 942-958) provide obligatory norms to direct the appropriate administration of this practice.

In the Archdiocese of Dubuque (and the Ecclesiastical Province of Iowa—the other three dioceses) the **normal stipend for a Mass intention is \$5.00.** If an individual wishes to give more than the customary stipend they **must personally or in writing specify this intention at the time of the offering.** If a person does not specify they wish more than the customary offering to be given to the priest, the total amount will be divided by 5 and the corresponding number of Mass intentions will be scheduled.

In regard to Mass intentions and the offering given, it must be reiterated that one is **not buying** a Mass. This is not a "quid pro quo" transaction. While the intention is publicly noted in the Bulletin and the priest specifically remembers it during the celebration of the Mass, the Mass is offered on behalf of the whole Church and its effects apply to the whole Church and, indeed, the whole world, and are not limited to the person or other intention requested by the donor.
