### Ash Wednesday and Lent, 2012

Please consult the Mass Schedule section of the Bulletin for the times of the Liturgies of Ash Wednesday this coming Wednesday, February 22<sup>nd</sup>. As in the past two years we will have two Liturgies of Word and Ashes and two Masses with the distribution of ashes to accommodate people's schedules.

Included in today's bulletin are two special Lenten inserts. One gives the regulations regarding fast and abstinence for the season along with a schedule for the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the season. As noted on the insert, the whole of the season has a penitential theme, not just Holy Week. Given fewer priests and schedule constraints, please celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation if possible prior to Holy Week. Additional times have been allotted for individual celebrations as well as the schedule for Communal celebrations here in our community to which we strongly encourage you to participate in since we are able to gather several priests to assist.

The second insert gives some practical ways to observe this special time by practicing the three traditional Lenten pillars of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving (works of justice/charity). The goal of Lent is not to prove that I can "give up something" for six weeks only to resume it after Easter. The goal of Lent is to grow in the Christ life given me in baptism. Come Easter, can I say "I have become a better Christian, a more faithful Catholic"? Hopefully, our "good habits" begun in Lent carry forward through Easter and beyond.

### 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time

It's astonishing to some people that we Catholics will spend time talking to a priest about our deepest faults. Confession of sins and being assured of God's forgiveness is not something that everyone readily understands. But when we take the time to really acknowledge our sinfulness, to admit to ourselves, to God, and to another person (the priest) what we have done wrong, we can experience the healing that comes from the confession of our sins.

The Gospel today explicitly reminds us that the forgiveness of sins is connected to healing. When we confess our sins, make an act of contrition, and receive absolution we are healed in that sacrament. The paralyzed man who was dropped through the roof in front of Jesus by his friends had his sins forgiven. Much to the astonishment of the crowd, the paralytic got up, rolled up his mat, and walked out the door. It was that easy.

There is a lot of misconception about the sacrament of penance. Once a person gets over the hurdle of fear or shame though, it really is as easy as the actions of the paralyzed man. There was a lot of work on the part of others to get him in front of Jesus. They had to carry him there, open the roof, and lower him down. And before we go to confession, there is some work we have to do. We have to examine our conscience, and be willing to be honest with ourselves and with God. But after that it's easy. We sit down, tell the priest our sins, receive a penance, pray a prayer of contrition, receive absolution, and then go on our way.

It is the work of reconciliation that takes much longer, sometimes even a lifetime. Because sin fractures relationships, confession really is the easy part. It is what we do afterwards to heal the wounds that is the most demanding. It is a good thing Lent begins on Wednesday!

**How will the St. Cecilia Church community benefit?** Assuming we find a coordinator for this ministry, we may be able to offer the following ministries: childcare for some faith formation events, nursery, children's liturgy of the Word and perhaps more.

**So what is needed to start?** A group of adults (age 18 and older) to complete Virtus (safe environment) training, meet with Tom Primmer our director of faith formation and begin planning and implementing this ministry of hospitality. **When will this ministry start?** When we have the structure in place to offer it, which begins with Virtus trained adults.
